Supplemental Information

Section 2. B.

The 303(d) listed waters that the MS4 discharges to are Waterbody ID TN05130202 (007-5000). The cause of impairment is; Total Phosphorus (nutrients); loss of biological integrity due to siltation (sediment); low dissolved oxygen (organic enrichment/oxygen depletion); and E-coli. Data was obtained from the draft 2016 303(d) list.

Section 2. D.

The MS4 does not discharge to Exceptional Tennessee Waters or Outstanding National Resource Waters

Section 2. E.

This permit requirement was not applicable for this annual report but will be completed if this requirement becomes applicable.

Section 3. C.

There are state and federal listed species in the area that the MS4 discharges to but the determination of the effect of MS4 discharges on the endangered species has not been determined. This determination as described in Sub-part 3.2.1 will be made prior upon issuance of the next permit.

Section 4. F.

Pamphlets for identification and reduction of pollutants associated with residential activities. Poster that identifies good housekeeping practices for commercial activities. The Town is participating with the Tennessee Association of Broadcasters (TAB) in the airing of storm water public service announcements.

Section 5.A.

An outfall and receiving waters map was completed early in the first permit cycle. This map has been and will be continually updated within each permit year.

Section 6.

Construction site and erosion and sediment control requirements contained in the current storm water ordinance will be revised to include appropriate requirements of the current Construction Site General Permit and appropriate requirements of the next MS4 permit cycle.

Section 8.

Storm water pollution prevention plans for applicable municipal operations will be completed upon issuance next permit. BMPs have been developed for some but not all of the MS4 activities.

Section 9.

Municipal operation activities related to parks are the responsibility of Williamson County.

Section 10.

A storm water management plan will be developed upon issuance of the next permit that documents elements of the City's storm water management program as required in the upcoming MS4 General Permit cycle. The storm water management plan will be updated to include new requirements contained in the new permit.

Section 11.

Indicators and tracking program to evaluate and measure progress of overall effectiveness of the Storm Water Management Program will be implemented upon issuance of the next permit.
